In October the children were hard at work in the Kindergarten classroom. With the beautiful first weeks of October the students had the opportunity to observe all the changes that take place as we moved into autumn. Our fall walk was a playful learning adventure where we used our senses to explore the changing leaves and trees, smell the freshness of the air, feel the cooler temperature, listen to the leaves crunch and laugh out loud as we tossed leaves into the sky. As we moved into all things Halloween, we had the opportunity to continue our number practice, learn some new songs and begin some work on patterns. Our Halloween party was fun for everyone!

What's Up Next



As we move into November, we will be working on learning about our 5 senses, how to make healthy food choices, and begin to learn about how our bodies work. I am excited to have Mad Science coming into our classroom to support us in learning about our sense of hearing! We will continue working on our letters through singing, printing in our booklets, and building words. November will see us practicing recognizing small groups of objects without using one to one correspondence and recognizing, extending, and building patterns.



In November, you will also be receiving a Progress Report for your child. The Progress Report allows me to provide you with information about how your child is setting into our classroom and what skills they are demonstrating up to this point in time. Please rest assured that if I have had any concerns about your child I would have already been in touch. This report just gives you a small window into the classroom. I will be offering parent-teacher conferences to any parents who are interested via Zoom, phone, or in person with masks and distancing. Please note that in order to attend an in person conference a parent will be required to show proof of vaccination or exemption to the front desk staff of the Dalhousie Community Centre. 


